

PORTOBELLO ROAD

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Yarn: Scheepjes Whirl 1 skein, 215g

Alternative: Viking bambino,

Crochet hook: 3,5 mm

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The inspiration for this shawl came to me during my trip to London this summer. A walk along Portobello road with the beautiful colorful houses side by side. So alike, but so different.



The first shawl is made with the super soft yarn bambino from Viking yarn, 4 different colours, the other is made using whirl, the delicious gradient yarn from Scheepjes.

Crochet terminology (US)

st= stitch

sc= single crochet

ch= chain

hdc= half double crochet

dc= double crochet

Fpdc= front post double crochet

Ch sp= chain space

******= you repeat the pattern between ****** the amount of times written in the pattern

Size: 28,5 cm wide and 151 cm long (

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Pattern:

If you are going to use whirl, start with taking off 5-6 g of yarn from the skein, later you will need it to make the lace border at this end of the shawl.

(every row beginning with a dc starts with ch 3, counts as the first dc, every row that starts with a sc, you turn with ch 1, which doesn't count as a stitch, if the row starts with fpdc you replace the first st with ch2 and end the row with a hdc)

Ch 71 with crochet hook 3,5 mm

1. 1 dc in the 4th ch from the hook, 1 dc in each ch, = 69 dc:s

2-4. 69 dc:s

5. Ch 1, 1 sc in each of the first 2 st, ch 4, skip 2 st, *1 sc in the next st, ch 4, skip 2 st*, repeat ** and end the row with 1 sc in each of the 2 last st.

6. Ch 3, 1 dc, ch 2, * 1 sc in the ch4-space, ch 4*, repeat ** until you made 1 sc in the last ch4-space, end the row with ch2 and 1 dc in each of the last 2 st.

7. Ch 1, 1sc in each of the 2 first st, ch 4, 1 sc in the first ch4-space, *ch 4, 1sc in the next ch space*, repeat** until you made 1sc in the last ch4-space, ch 4, 1sc in each of the 2 last st.

8. Ch 3, 1dc in the next st,* 3 dc in the ch4-space*, repeat ** until you have 1 ch4-space left, 2 dc in the last ch4-space and 1 dc in each of the last 2 st.

9. 69 dc:s

10. Ch2, *1 fpdc*, repeat ** until 1 st remains and end the row with a hdc.

11. 69 dc:s.

12. Ch 3, 1 dc, *skip 2 st, (3 dc, ch 2, 3 dc) in the next st, skip 2 st, 1 dc in the next st*, repeat ** until 7 st remains, skip 2 st, (3dc, ch 2, 3 dc) in the next st, skip 2 st, end with 1 dc in each of the last 2 st.

13-16. Ch 3, 1dc, *(3 dc, ch 2, 3 dc) in the ch2-space, 1 dc in the dc from last row*, repeat until 1 ch2-space remains, (3 dc, ch 2, 3 dc) in the last ch2-space, end the row with 2 dc.

17. Ch 3, 1 dc, ch 2, *1 sc in the ch2-space, ch 2, 1 dc in the dc from last row, ch 2*, repeat ** until 1 ch2-space remains, 1 sc in the last ch2-space, ch 2, 2 dc.



18. Ch 3, 1 dc, 2 dc in the ch2-space, 1dc in the sc from last row, *2 dc in the ch2-space, 1dc in the dc from last row, 2 dc in the ch2-space, 1dc in the sc from last row*, repeat ** until 1 ch2-space remains, 2 dc in the last ch2-space, 2 dc.

19. 69 dc:s.

20. Ch2, *1 fpdc*, repeat ** until 1 st remains and end the row with a hdc.

21. 69 dc:s

22. 69 sc:s

23-30. Ch 1, 1 sc,* (1 sc, 2 dc) in the next st, skip 2 st*, repeat ** and end the row with 2 sc..

31. 69 sc:s.

32-33. 69 dc:s.

34. Ch2, *1 fpdc*, repeat ** until 1 st remains and end the row with a hdc.

35. 69 dc:s

36. 69 sc:s

Crochet the rows 5-36 6 times, rows 5-9 one more time. Repeat row 9 2 more times and end with 1 row sc:s. Now it's time for the lace border.

Border:

1. Ch 3, 1 dc, *skip 2 st, (3 dc, ch 2, 3 dc) in the next st, skip 2 st, 1 dc in the next st*, repeat ** until 7 st remains, skip 2 st, (3dc, ch 2, 3 dc) in the next st, skip 2 st, end with 1 dc in each of the last 2 st.

2-3. Ch 3, 1dc, *(3 dc, ch 2, 3 dc) in the ch2-space, 1dc in the dc from last row*, repeat ** until 1 ch2-space remains, (3 dc, ch 2, 3 dc) in the last ch2-space, end with 2dc.

Now you take the piece of yarn, which you saved in the beginning and make a border at the other side of the shawl. Start from the right side and make the border rows 1-3



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
